




Safety Suggestions

Use the following rules as guidelines for the safe operation and use of your Amigo. Should you have any questions about the safe operation or use of your Amigo, please contact AMI. If you are in doubt about your ability to operate your Amigo, consult your personal physician.

PERSONAL SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS! —

- Keep legs on the platform while driving the Amigo.
- · Drive slowly while turning and on inclines.
- Drive straight up and down inclines.
- Do not park on inclines/declines.
- Your Amigo is restricted to one occupant.
- Occupant must remain seated while Amigo is in operation.
- Lock seat in forward position before operating Amigo.
- Maximum load capacity is 350 pounds (157.5 kg).
- Armrests and handlebar must be in riding position while operating your Amigo.





- Make sure the batteries are held securely in place.
- Use dual wheels for added stability (Applies to AMIGO DELUXE model only).
- Do not drive over or off obstacles more than 1 inch (2.54 cm) high. This could be unsafe and could damage your Amigo.
- Do not make sharp, abrupt turns at high speeds or going down an incline.
- Avoid sudden starts while the handlebar is turned sharply.
- Avoid inclines or ramps having a rise of more than 1 inch (2.54 cm) per foot (meter) (Federal standard for wheelchair ramps).
- Do not operate on streets or other areas with vehicular traffic.
- When driving over bumps, dips or inclines, approach them at a 90-degree angle.
- Do not back onto any changes in the surface or grade.
- Do not sit on the Amigo in a moving vehicle.
- When operating under low light conditions, the user should equip the Amigo with proper lighting.
- Operate your Amigo only when the power seat lift is in its lowest position.
- When stopped or transferring, always turn the key switch OFF (on AMIGO DELUXE or AMIGO IV).

△ CAUTION

Turning the key "OFF" while in motion will bring the Amigo to an abrupt stop.


• TO STOP IN EMERGENCY SITUA-TIONS ONLY, USE THE SAFETY BRAKE. To disengage the brake, reverse the direction of your Amigo. Note: Repeated use of the safety brake will result in excessive tire wear.

△ CAUTION


Do not use a garden hose to clean your tires. Water may get into the controller and cause electronic malfunctions.

- When transferring off your Amigo, make sure the seat lock is in the locked position.
- To transport the Amigo, DO NOT remove handle from steering column. Instead, loosen the knob near the bottom of the handle so you can fold the handle down to the base. Place handle down so that the membrane switch will not become damaged. Tighten the knob to secure the handle.
- When utilizing public transportation, do not sit on your Amigo while it is being lifted onto the vehicle. Where this is not possible, a proper hold-down system should be provided.

The Quik-Stop™ Safety Brake is equipped on the Centra, Deluxe and Amigo IV. It overrides the electrical system to allow you to manually stop in case of emergency. See page 20 for instructions.









DOWN TO BASICS



Assembly Instructions

• HANDLE ADJUSTMENT

To adjust the angle of the handle, loosen the lower knob to separate the meshed teeth. Move the handle into the desired position and tighten the knob (Figure 1).

Telescopic Handle: The Amigo telescopic handle can be adjusted from 19 inches (48.26 cm) to 23 inches (58.42 cm). It is factory set to 23 inches (58.42 cm). If adjustment is needed, please see your local Amigo Dealer or call Amigo Mobility International, Inc. *This option is not available for the Amigo Centra.*

SEAT INSTALLATION

- 1. Unlock the seat lock.
- 2. Insert the upper seat post into the opening of the lower seat post.

- 3. Spin seat around to make sure it rotates freely.
- 4. To lock the seat, pull the seat lock lever toward the rear of the seat.

Note: The following information pertains to Amigos that **do not** have a power seat lift.

To raise or lower your seat height, remove the nut and bolt that holds the seat collar in place on the seat post, then adjust and reinstall in one of the holes on the seat post.

△ CAUTION

It is recommended that the seat lock be installed in the second or third hole positioned from the seat. If you desire to put your seat higher than this, you must have stability wheels or dual wheels on your Amigo.





SEAT POSITIONING

For comfort and convenience, the seat can be moved closer to or away from the handle. The rear housing must be removed and the lower seat post must be reversed (Two different sets of mounting holes in the platform are used). It will move the post approximately 3 inches (7.62 cm) to the front or rear, depending on the direction it is turned.

• DUAL & STABILITY WHEELS

AMIGO CENTRA A and B

Front stability wheel attachments provide additional stability and are required for use on rough or uneven surfaces. The stability attachment mounted below the base just behind the front wheel should not be removed. It offers increased stability without making your Amigo wider.

⚠ CAUTION

Do not drive at full speed into any fixed obstacles or objects as this may cause cracking of the base or damage to the stability wheel attachment.

AMIGO DELUXE:

Dual wheels provide additional stability and are required on rough or uneven surfaces.

Removal of Dual Wheels:

Dual wheels on the Deluxe can be removed indoors for greater maneuverability in narrow areas.

Please refer to Figure 2 for the following:

Grasp the outer wheel with both hands while depressing the small button at the center of the quick release pin with your thumb. Pull the wheel toward you to remove.

Installation of Dual Wheels:

Please refer to Figure 3 for the following:

- 1. Depress button in the quick release pin in the center of the outer dual wheel. Holding the dual wheel and pin, bring it toward the drive wheel.
- 2. Guide the bore coupling into the center hole of the inner drive wheel.
- 3. Turn the outer wheel so that the

- bore coupling grooves line up with the grooves in the coupling on the drive wheel.
- 4. Push the outer wheel in until the button of the quick release pin snaps out and the wheel cannot turn in either direction separate from the inner wheel.
- 5. Make sure the wheel is securely attached. Try to pull out the dual wheel to insure it will not come off.

NOTE: To ease the removal and installation of the Dual Wheels (without the occupant), tilt the AMIGO DELUXE to either side.

• BATTERY INFORMATION AND CHARGER INSTRUCTIONS

ATTENTION

Your batteries have been placed backwards in the battery holder for safety during shipping. You will have to pull them out, turn them around and put them back in the battery holder to operate your Amigo.

Spill-proof and maintenance-free, 12-volt

batteries have been supplied. Always turn your Amigo OFF before removing and installing batteries.

For maximum range and life, it is recommended to fully charge the batteries before using. Extended charging is good for the batteries. The batteries will not overcharge.

It is a popular misconception that batteries should be deeply discharged before recharging. This is not the proper procedure for batteries. They can actually be damaged if they are discharged too deeply before recharging.

Charge your batteries daily when the Amigo is used.

AMIGO DELUXE and AMIGO IV:

A sophisticated battery indicator and battery diagnostic system are incorporated into the touch panel of your Amigo. The battery icon LED will be lit whenever the key is in the "ON" position. However, if the Amigo is inactive for more than twenty-three minutes, the power is automatically turned off. To reactivate your Amigo, switch it "OFF" and then "ON" again to regain full function. This feature will conserve battery power so you do not have

Universal Charger Option

A Universal Charger is available on many Amigos sold outside the United States. The Universal Charger uses a range of 90-240 volts AC power input. This makes it possible to charge on any electrical system globally. (The Universal Charger is an option on models in the US for people who travel abroad and want this universal charging flexibility.)

Your charger is labeled identifying which charging system it uses.

△ CAUTION

Do not use a 24-volt charger that is configured to a 120-volt AC power input outside the US in countries using 220-volt AC power input. Damage will occur to the charger.

to remember to switch your power off when your Amigo is idling or inactive for extended periods of time.

Charging Procedure for Batteries on the Amigo Deluxe and Amigo IV:

The battery status gauge, in the middle of the touch panel, indicates the amount of battery charge. When the tallest segment bar on the battery icon is lit and blinking, your batteries are fully charged. If the shortest battery capacity LED segment is "ON" and it flashes, along with a low chirping of the horn at one minute intervals, batteries should be charged soon.

To charge your batteries, place your Amigo near an AC outlet. Pull gently on the plug in the rear cover near the rear bumper. Pull as much cord as needed (up to 12 feet/3.64 meters) to reach to the AC outlet. Connect the reel cord plug to the outlet. Observe the illuminated bar on the battery icon LED. It will drop down to the shortest segment on the far left and blink. Gradually the lights will move to the taller bars as the battery charge increases.

The batteries are fully charged when the tallest bar on the far right is blinking. Your Amigo can be charged with the key in the "ON"

or "OFF" position; however, it cannot be driven during charging.

CENTRA A and B:

When the red light on the handle glows, the power switch is "ON."

Charging Procedure for Batteries on the Centra A and B:

Park near an AC outlet. Connect the AC charging cord to the socket in the rear cover near the rear bumper and the other end to the wall outlet. Observe the LED light on the handle control panel. As soon as the charger is plugged in and the batteries are in the charging mode, the LED light will blink for a short period of time (approximately 20 seconds) and then glow continuously until the batteries are fully charged, then the red light will flash. While in the charging mode, your Amigo cannot be driven.

The charging cycle is completed and your batteries are fully charged when the LED light is blinking while still in the charging mode.



Battery Diagnostic System on Amigo Deluxe and Amigo IV:

Two small circular lights, on each side of the battery icon, will illuminate only if the left or right battery is defective and unable to maintain a desirable charge. This indication will display only while in the charging mode (when power cord is plugged into AC outlet).

Battery Maintenance:

See page 22 in the Maintenance Section.

△ CAUTION

Make sure that the wall cord is unplugged from the wall outlet before moving your Amigo.

• CIRCUIT BREAKER & FUSE REPLACEMENT INSTRUCTIONS

A circuit breaker protects the wiring and battery in the event of a short circuit. If your Amigo stops, check for overloads or short circuits before continuing to operate.

AMIGO CENTRA A and B, AMIGO DELUXE and AMIGO IV:

The circuit breaker is under the rear housing and attached to the positive terminal in front of the battery holder (Figure 4).


SERVICING YOUR OPTIONAL LIGHTING PACKAGE:

- 1. Remove the batteries.
- 2. Check for blown fuses. If a fuse is blown, pop it out and replace it.
- 3. Check for loose wires, and reconnect them if necessary.
- 4. Replace the batteries.

BATTERY STORAGE


If you remove your batteries from your Amigo, put them on a surface that cannot be damaged by acid fumes. Whenever a battery is charged and discharged through a cycle, it breathes. The breathing of the battery emits acid fumes into the cloth strap that may mark surfaces it rests on for long periods of time.

If you are having any further problems, contact your Amigo Service Representative.



⚠ WARNING

To avoid damage to batteries during storage, DO NOT place them end to end with positive (+) and negative (-) terminals next to each other.

• HANDLE

To adjust the position of your handle controls, see page 7.

AMIGO CENTRA A and B:

Controls include: (See Figure 5)Top speed limiting dial, key lock and battery indicator light. The key lock, on the right side of the control box, will turn the power ON or OFF. The top speed may be adjusted with the knob in the middle of the control panel (See Figure 11). By turning this knob to the HI position your Amigo can drive up to 4.5 miles per hour (7.25 kph). When the knob is set to LO position, the speed will be reduced to a slow creep, ideal for less experienced drivers and operating indoors.

AMIGO DELUXE and AMIGO IV:

The controls include: maximum speed dial, key lock, power seat lift, headlight, directional lights, horn, electromagnetic brake and a battery indicator (See Figure 6).

THE KEY LOCK

To turn power ON insert the key and turn it counterclockwise to ON position. The key lock is on the right side of the membrane enclosure box (See Figure 7). When the power is ON, the battery and speed indicator displays will light up showing the level of charge contained in your battery and the last recorded speed setting prior to the unit being powered down. Your Amigo will automatically shut itself OFF

Top View of Handle



Membrane Switch











Figure 10 Figure 11

after about 23 minutes of inactivity. To reactivate your Amigo, switch the key lock OFF and then ON. This feature prevents battery drainage.

TOP SPEED

Regulate your maximum speed with the rabbit and turtle switches or speed knob (See Figure 8). To increase your top speed (up to 4 mph/6.44 kph on the Amigo IV and 4.5 mph/7.25 kph on the Amigo Deluxe). press the rabbit button. To lower the top speed, press the turtle button. Each segment in the speed gauge corresponds with approximately 15 to 20 percent of the maximum speed. Every time a button on the membrane switch is activated, you will hear a "chirp." The speed setting has approximately 200 possible increments (See Figure 9), so you may have to press the turtle or rabbit button several times to see a change in the gauge. Reduction of top speed does not noticeably reduce power of your motor (only on PMAs with the membrane switch panel). An audio signal indicates highest and lowest speed settings.

HORN

The horn button can be used to avoid confrontation with pedestrian or other vehicles (See Figure 10).

DRIVING YOUR AMIGO

To move forward, pull the right side of the hand control lever toward you (See Figure 12). You can also move forward by pushing the left side of the control lever away from you. By releasing the control lever, you will come to a stop approximately one second after release. To operate in reverse, pull the left side of the hand control lever toward you, or push the right side control lever away from you.

MANUAL PUSHING

For safety and security, your Amigo is equipped with an electromagnetic brake which makes pushing your Amigo almost impossible. On the Amigo Deluxe and Amigo IV, the electromagnetic brake can be released manually by pushing forward the brake lever in the back of the rear cover, or *electronically* by pressing twice on the brake release button on the membrane switch (See Figure 13). When your Amigo is in the freewheeling mode, the low speed segment will blink and it can be pushed freely. The Centra is only equipped with a manual freewheeling lever in the back of the rear cover. With the manual brake release the freewheeling mode can be terminated by using the brake lever towards the rear of the Amigo.

On Amigos Equipped With Electromagnetic Releases:

The freewheeling mode will last until some other function on the membrane is activated (with the exception of the horn switch) or the throttle lever is moved from its resting position.

• POWER SEAT LIFT OPERATION -

(Optional)

The power seat lift adjusts the seat between 18 and 23 inches (45.72 cm and 58.42 cm) from the floor. Seat must be in lowest position when the Amigo is in motion.

AMIGO CENTRA A and B:

Move the lift switch located under the seat up or down to raise or lower it.

AMIGO DELUXE and AMIGO IV:

To operate the power seat lift use seat/arrow buttons pictured (See Figure 14). To lift the seat to desired height, press the top button with the seat icon. To lower the seat, press the seat button with the arrow pointing down. The power seat lift can be activated only when you are not moving.



Seat Lift







Headlight & Tailight Switches





• POWER SEAT LIFT MAINTENANCE

Approximately every 1 to 2 months, remove the seat and activate seat lift to the highest position. Using a dry cloth, wipe inner tube of accumulated grease and dirt. Then, apply a very thin coating of grease to inner tube, except for the top inch of the tube.

Note: A tube of grease has been supplied. White Lithium grease is recommended and can be purchased at your local hardware store.

• OPTIONAL EQUIPMENT

AMIGO DELUXE and AMIGO IV:

The lighting package includes a front headlight mounted on the handle and rear red and yellow lights. The red operational lights and the front light can be activated by pressing the headlight switch. Press this switch again to turn the lights off.

The rear turn signal light can be activated by pressing the left or right turn signal buttons. Indicate a "hazard" condition by pressing

both turn signals. The power must be ON to operate the lights (Figure 15).

• MANUALLY TRANSPORTING YOUR AMIGO

Your Amigo can be disassembled and transported in most car trunks (Figure 16).

- 1. Turn OFF your Amigo.
- 2. Unlock the seat and remove it completely.
- 3. Remove the batteries.
- 4. Fold handle down to platform (See page 7).
- 5. Lift the rear into the trunk of the vehicle and slide the Amigo into the trunk.

Note: When batteries are removed, the wheels will not rotate for safety purposes.

- 6. Place seat and batteries into the trunk. *Note: For proper battery storage, see page 11.*
- 7. If your Amigo has a power seat lift, we suggest placing a cut out tennis ball or something similar over the seat post to protect it. If you leave the batteries connected, make sure the

lift cannot be accidentally activated. The electromagnetic brake must be in the "normal" position.

• LOAD YOUR AMIGO INTO YOUR CAR WITH A LIFT•ALL®

Note: For greater convenience, obtain a Lift•All® to assist you when loading and unloading. For more information on the Lift•All®, contact your local Amigo Mobility Center® or call toll-free: 1-800-248-9131. For your safety, use hold-down systems to secure your Amigo during transport. We do not recommend using the Amigo with elevated van lifts.

AIRPLANE TRAVEL

An Airline Travel Kit (Item #300116) is available from Amigo Mobility International, Inc. It contains a battery holding strap, three "Special Handling" tags and a "Helpful Hints for Airline Travel" booklet. Nonspillable batteries are approved for travel on airplanes. When you make your reservation, notify the airline that you will be requesting an "Escort" service.

This will assure you that your Amigo will be picked up and delivered at the boarding gate.

GROUND TRAVEL

Some public transportation systems have accommodations for your Amigo, but you must transfer to a seat.

Instructions to Baggage Handlers

- 1. Make an instruction tag and attach it to your Platform Mobility Aid (PMA) in a conspicuous place.
- 2. List the following instructions:

TO ROLL:

Holding onto handle and armrest, tilt so one rear wheel is not touching the ground.

TO CARRY:

Lift by rear bumper of the platform. If a basket is attached, use the sides of the bumper. Do not lift by seat, arms, or plastic housing.

BATTERIES:

Located directly below the seat in plastic housing. Disconnect by lifting each battery, turning 180 degrees and placing back in battery bucket. Brass battery connectors should face the rear. Strap batteries in place.

Amigo owners say that the best way to insure proper handling is to deliver your PMA personally to the handler and explain face-toface the instructions and add the ever-powerful statement, "This is my legs."







Helpful Hints for Everyday Use

BATHROOM

In the bathroom, maneuvering room is usually limited. Position close to the toilet, swivel the seat, lock it in position and transfer.

When using the bathtub, back up parallel to the tub. Swivel the seat and place your feet in the tub. Engage seat lock and carefully transfer.

<u>M</u>WARNING

Do not use your Amigo while taking a shower. The water may get into the controller and cause electronic malfunctions.

BEDROOM

To transfer to the bed, back up parallel to the bed. Swivel, lock seat into position, and ease

onto the bed. If charging the batteries overnight, it may be easiest to plug in the battery charger before transferring. For added ease, when using a power seat lift, raise your seat slightly higher than the surface from which you are transferring.

KITCHEN

For access to a refrigerator, make a parallel approach or back up to the outside of the refrigerator. Swivel the seat.

Approach a table, sink, or stove by maneuvering parallel to it. Swivel the seat to the desired position. The handle will be out of the way.

• CAR

To transfer to a car, make a parallel approach to the side of the car, release the door latch, and open the door as you drive forward. Back parallel to the side of the car and into the door opening. Swivel the seat and lock it in position and carefully slide onto the car seat. On the driver's side you can use the steering wheel for leverage.

• RAMPS AND INCLINES

- Always lean forward as you maneuver your Amigo up a ramp or incline of an angle equal to 1 inch (2.54 cm) of rise to 12 inches (30.48 cm) of travel length.
- Engage your seat lock when travelling up ramps or inclines.
- Lower the speed setting to the slowest speed.

USING AN ELEVATOR

Backing into an elevator allows you to exit forward. Be sure the elevator is level with the floor.

• OPENING DOORS

When a door opens toward you, approach at an angle and just off to one side. Grasp the door knob, reverse and pull the door open. For doors that open away from you, position the bumper against the door, close to the doorjamb on the doorknob side of the door. After you release the latch, use the bumper to push the door open.

⚠ CAUTION

BE CAREFUL WITH GLASS DOORS TO AVOID PERSONAL INJURY!

• KEEP YOUR AMIGO SHINING

Clean a fabric seat with upholstery cleaner or wash with mild soap and water. Wipe the naugahyde seat clean with a damp cloth. Protect the housings and all painted parts with a coat of auto wax.



⚠ WARNING

Do not expose your Amigo to spray-on cleaning solutions and excessive moisture such as spraying it with a garden hose, shower, or leaving it uncovered in heavy rain.

Excessive moisture around the controller or electrical connections may cause contamination of electrical circuitry, damage and malfunction as well as personal injury.

SPEED CONTROLS

Slower speeds are recommended indoors and while learning to operate your Amigo. Higher speeds can be used when conditions allow.

Reducing your top speed does not noticeably reduce power of your motor (on PMAs with a membrane switch panel).

STOPPING

- 1. Dynamic braking will gradually bring your Amigo to a stop on a level surface.
- 2. The Electromagnetic Brake will stop your Amigo one to two seconds after releasing thumb control.

⚠ CAUTION

3. IN EMERGENCY ONLY -QUIK-STOP" SAFETY BRAKE SYSTEM Quick stopping your Amigo when moving forward in your Amigo can be accomplished by pushing on the safety brake lever. Use the safety brake for emergency stops only. The brake causes the Amigo to stop suddenly. Excessive use may cause premature wear on tires and drive components. To disengage the brake, reverse the direction of the Amigo. In order for the safety brake system on Amigo RWDs with pneumatic tires to function properly, the tires must have the recommended tire pressure of 50 psi (22.5 kg/cm). Deviation from this tire pressure will result in reduced stopping ability and undue tire wear.

⚠ CAUTION

Braking action in reverse is minimal and will not cause the Amigo to come to a sudden stop.

Notice: When operating the Quik-Stop™ Safety Brake on declines, the brake will engage and stay locked after engagement. On level surfaces, it may or may not disengage. This is for your safety. To release the brake, you may need to reverse the direction of your Amigo.





Maintenance

Minimum maintenance is required to increase your service ease and dependability. Check the following:

• DAILY

- Maintain battery charge.

• IF YOU USE YOUR AMIGO DAILY

 It is important to charge the battery daily. Charge the battery until fully charged to ensure battery operation throughout the cold weather months.

Storage Tip: Extended charging is good for the batteries. The batteries will not overcharge. Charge battery fully and store indoors in an arid environment. Do not store on concrete since this will continue to draw on the battery. Protect your battery by placing it on a wood block instead.

MONTHLY

- Check and clean battery terminals and

the copper connections as needed with a light piece of emery cloth. Lightly pull copper spring tabs out 1/8 inch (.32 cm) to 1/4 inch (.64 cm) to insure successful connection when battery is replaced.

 Clean upholstery, plastic and metal with a mild surface cleaner.



Keep cleaning solvents, away from electrical wires and connections.

- Check front wheel bearings for roughness during rotation. Replace if necessary.

- Remove wide-track dual wheels and inspect interconnecting parts



of the dual wheels and drive wheels for signs of corrosion. Wipe clean and lightly coat interconnecting parts with lubricant or grease.

 Check tire pressure. Pneumatic tires on rear wheels should be maintained at 40-50 psi (18-22.5 kg/cm).

• 3 MONTHS

- Lubricate steering column and seat post.
- Check all screws and clips holding wheels for tightness and wear.

- Check the brass barrels on your batteries. If a flat spot has developed, rotate the barrel for better contact.
- Check all electrical connections for clean contact.
- Charging connection should be inspected for tight connection.
- Check tires for wear.
- Inspect seat posts for cracks or breaks in welds.

YEARLY

- Have your authorized service center

- check your Amigo completely.
- Replace the foam in your padded fold-down seat if applicable.
- Replace the foam in your padded, fold-down seat if applicable.

• CONTROLLER

Do not attempt to service the controller or related electronic components as you may void your warranty.

• UNIPAC® DRIVE

Your UNIPAC® drive system is a precision assembly lubricated for long service. Do not attempt to open and service the assembly, which could void your warranty. Contact your authorized service center if problems occur, or call 1-800-248-9131 to speak to a manufacturer service representative.


CHARGER REEL CORD

Through repeated usages, the cord can become twisted in the charger reel. Every three months, extend the cord to its fullest length. Flatten the cord, taking out all twists that have developed in the flattened surfaces. This will allow proper functioning of the cord reel. If you experience problems operating the cord reel, you may need to repeat this action monthly.

AMIGO DELUXE:

Tools: Two 1/2-inch sockets (13 mm), small screw driver, two long shank screwdrivers, Phillips screwdriver, 1/8-inch (3 mm) allen wrench, 3/8-inch (10 mm) open end wrench.

Disassembly:

- 1. Remove seat from the Amigo.
- 2. Remove batteries and battery case cover (Amigo Deluxe).
- 3. Remove rear cover.
- 4. Remove dual wheels from the same side of the Amigo in which the tire needs repairing, or remove center cap from rim if the dual wheels are not in place.
- 5. Remove shoulder screw, washers, and nut holding rear wheel adapter assembly to axle. Slide assembly off axle, tapping with mallet if necessary.
- 6. If the tires are pneumatic and not foam-filled, release any air pressure from the tire by depressing



- the needle on valve with the tip of a small screwdriver or similar instrument (Be careful not to damage the valve).
- 7. When all the air has been released, the rim can be disassembled and removed from the wheel assembly by removing the four screws and nuts which hold it together. This requires two 1/2-inch sockets (13 mm).
- 8. If the rim does not easily disassemble after removing screws and nuts, use two long shank screwdrivers to gently pry the tire from the rim. Be careful not to damage the inner tube of the tire.

Reassembly:

- 1. Release all air from the inner tube if tires are pneumatic.
- 2. Insert inner tube inside tire with valve stem pointing out.
- 3. Insert one rim half inside tire making sure the valve stem of the tube fits in the cutout on the inner face of the rim.
- 4. Put the two halves together (Do not pinch inner tube).
- 5. Insert the four screws through the rim and adapter making sure the screw

- heads are on the opposite side of the valve stem.
- 6. Place the locknuts on screws and tighten the assembly together.
- 7. Inflate tire to 40-50 psi (18-22.5 kg/cm).

Note: Replace spacer and shim washers. Then slide wheel assembly over axle, using a light oil lubricant if necessary. Reinstall shoulder screw, washers, and nut.

- 4. Seats and other components have a one-(1) year warranty and are covered against defects in materials and workmanship for one year from date of purchase.
- 5. Use of this product by persons exceeding 350 lbs. (157.5 kgs.) on the composite platform, 250 lbs. (112.5 kgs.) on the aluminum and steel platform, 250 lbs. (112.5 kgs.) on a power seat lift, and 200 lbs. (90 kgs.) on the Lift•All® is not recommended and voids this warranty.




Amigo Centra A and B

WARNING: Radio wave sources may affect powered wheelchair control

Radio wave sources, such as radio stations, TV stations, amateur radio (HAM) transmitters, two-way radios, and cellular phones, can affect powered wheelchairs and motorized scooters (in this text, both will be called powered wheelchairs). Following the warnings listed below should reduce the chance of unintended brake release or powered wheelchair movement which could result in serious injury.

- Do not turn ON hand-held personal communication devices, such as citizens band (CB) radios and cellular phones, while the powered wheelchair is turned ON;
- Be aware of nearby transmitters, such as radio or TV stations, and try to avoid coming close to them;
- If unintended movement or brake release occurs, turn the powered wheelchair OFF as soon as it is safe;
- 4) Be aware that adding accessories or components, or modifying the powered wheelchair, may make it more susceptible to interference from radio wave sources (Note: There is no easy way to evaluate their effect on the overall immunity of the powered wheelchair); and
- 5) Report all incidents of unintended movement or brake release to the manufacturer, and note whether there is a radio wave source nearby.

Important Information

- 20 volts per meter (V/m) is a generally achievable and useful immunity level against interference from radio wave sources (as of May 1994) (the higher the level, the greater the protection);
- 2) The immunity level of this product is not known.

CAUTION: It is very important that you read this information regarding the possible effects of electromagnetic interference on your powered wheelchair.

Electromagnetic Interference (EMI) From Radio Wave Sources

Powered wheelchairs and motorized scooters (in this text, both will be referred to as powered wheelchairs) may be susceptible to electromagnetic interference (EMI), which is interfering electromagnetic energy (EM) emitted from sources such as radio stations, TV stations, amateur radio (HAM) transmitters, two-way radios, and cellular phones. The interference (from radio wave sources) can cause the powered wheelchair to release its brakes, move by itself, or move in unintended directions. It can also permanently damage the powered wheelchair's control system. The intensity of the interfering EM energy can be measured in volts per meter (V/m). Each powered wheelchair can resist EMI up to a certain intensity. This is called its "immunity level." The higher the immunity level, the greater the protection. At this time, current technology is capable of achieving at least a 20 V/m immunity level, which would provide useful protection from the more common sources of radiated EMI. The immunity level of this powered wheelchair model is not known.

There are a number of sources of relatively intense electromagnetic fields in the everyday environment. Some of these sources are obvious and easy to avoid. Others are not apparent and exposure is unavoidable. However, we believe that by following the warnings listed below, your risk to EMI will be minimized.

The sources of radiated EMI can be broadly classified into three types:

- Hand-held portable transceivers (transmitters-receivers) with antenna mounted directly on the transmitting unit. Examples include: citizens band (CB) radios, "walkie talkie," security, fire, and police transceivers, cellular telephones, and other personal communication devices. Note: Some cellular telephones and similar devices transmit signals while they are ON, even when not being used;
- 2) Medium-range mobile transceivers, such as those used in police cars, fire trucks, ambulances, and taxis. These usually have the antenna mounted on the outside of the vehicle; and
- 3) Long-range transmitters and transceivers, such as commercial broadcast transmitters (radio and TV broadcast antenna towers) and amateur (HAM) radios. Note: Other types of hand-held devices, such as cordless phones, laptop computers, AM/FM radios, TV sets, CD players, and cassette players, and small appliances, such as electric shavers and hair dryers, so far as we know, are not likely to cause EMI problems to your powered wheelchair.

Powered Wheelchair Electromagnetic Interference (EMI)

Because EM energy rapidly becomes more intense as one moves closer to the transmitting antenna (source), the EM fields from hand-held radio wave sources (transceivers) are of special concern. It is possible to unintentionally bring high levels of EM energy very close to the powered wheelchair's control system while using these devices. This can affect powered wheelchair movement and braking. Therefore, the warnings listed below are recommended to prevent possible interference with the control system of the powered wheelchair.

Warnings

Electromagnetic interference (EMI) from sources such as radio and TV stations, amateur radio (HAM) transmitters, two-way radios, and cellular phones can affect powered wheelchairs and motorized scooters. Following the warnings listed below should reduce the chance of unintended brake release or powered wheelchair movement which could result in serious injury.

- Do not operate hand-held transceivers (transmitters-receivers), such as citizens band (CB) radios, or turn ON personal communication devices, such as cellular phones, while the powered wheelchair is turned ON;
- 2) Be aware of nearby transmitters, such as radio or TV stations, and try to avoid coming close to them;
- 3) If unintended movement or brake release occurs, turn the powered wheelchair OFF as soon as it is safe;
- 4) Be aware that adding accessories or components, or modifying the powered wheelchair, may make it more susceptible to EMI (Note: There is no easy way to evaluate their effect on the overall immunity of the powered wheelchair); and
- Report all incidents of unintended movement or brake release to the powered wheelchair manufacturer, and note whether there is a source of EMI nearby.
