

As a manufacturer of powered scooters, Invacare endeavors to supply a wide variety of powered scooters to meet the many needs of the user. However, final selection of the type of powered scooter to be used by an individual rests solely with the user and his/her healthcare professional capable of making such a selection.

TIE-DOWN RESTRAINTS AND SEAT POSITIONING STRAPS

Invacare recommends that powered scooter users NOT be transported in vehicles of any kind while in a powered scooter. As of this date, the Department of Transportation has not approved any tie-down systems for transportation of a user while in a powered scooter, in a moving vehicle of any type.

It is the position of Invacare that users of powered scooter should be transferred into appropriate seating in vehicles for transportation and use be made of the restraints made available by the auto industry. Invacare cannot and does not recommend any powered scooter transportation systems.

AS REGARDS RESTRAINTS - SEAT POSITIONING STRAP - IT IS THE OBLIGATION OF THE DME DEALER, THERAPISTS AND OTHER HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS TO DETERMINE IF A SEAT POSITIONONG STAP IS REQUIRED TO ENSURE THE SAFE OPERATION OF THIS EQUIPMENT BY THE USER. OPERATING INFORMATION

GENERAL WARNINGS

Performance adjustments should ONLY be made by professionals of the healthcare field or persons fully conversant with this process and the driver's capabilities. Incorrect settings could cause injury to the driver, bystanders, damage to the powered scooter and surrounding property.

DO NOT use parts, accessories, or adapters other than those authorized by Invacare.

ELECTRICAL

Check to ensure that all electrical connections are secure at all times.

Grounding Instructions:

DO NOT, under any circumstances, cut or remove the round grounding prong from any plug. Some devices are equipped with three-prong (grounding) plugs for protection against possible shock hazards. Where a two-prong wall receptacle is encountered, it is the personal responsibility and obligation of the customer to contact a qualified electrician and have the two-prong receptacle replaced with a properly grounded three-prong wall receptacle in accordance with the National Electrical Code. If you must use an extension cord, use ONLY a three-wire extension cord having the same or higher electrical rating as the device being connected.

BATTERIES

Only deep cycle, sealed case construction batteries should be used in this device.

Carefully read battery/battery charger information prior to installing, servicing or operating your powered scooter. In addition, Invacare has placed WARNING TAGS on batteries and IDENTIFICATIONS TAGS on battery cables. DO NOT remove these tags.

EMI WARNINGS

CAUTION: IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT YOU READ THIS INFORMATION REGARDING THE POSSIBLE EFFECTS OF ELECTROMAGNETIC INTERFERENCE ON YOUR POWERED SCOOTER.

Electromagnetic Interference EMI From Radio Wave sources.

Powered scooters may be susceptible to electromagnetic interference (EMI), which is interfering electromagnetic energy (EM) emitted from sources such as radio stations, TV stations, amateur radio (HAM) transmitters, two way radios, and cellular phones. The interference (from radio wave sources) can cause the powered scooter to release its brakes, move by itself, or move in unintended directions. It can also permanently damage the powered scooter's control system. The intensity of the interfering EM energy can be measured in volts per meter (V/m). Each powered scooter can resist EMI up to a certain intensity. This is called its "immunity level." The higher the immunity level, the greater the protection. At this time, current technology is capable of achieving at least a 20 V/m immunity level, which would provide useful protection from the more common sources of radiated EMI.

There are a number of sources of relatively intense electromagnetic fields in the everyday environment. Some of these sources are obvious and easy to avoid. Others are not apparent and exposure is unavoidable. However, we believe that by following the warnings listed, your risk to EMI will be minimized.

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EMI WARNINGS (CONTINUED)

The sources of radiated EMI can be broadly classified into three types:

- Hand-held Portable transceivers (transmitters-receivers with the antenna mounted directly on the transmitting unit. Examples include: citizens band (CB) radios, "walkie talkie," security, fire, and police transceivers, cellular telephones, and other personal communication devices. **NOTE: Some cellular telephones and similar devices transmit signals while they are ON, even when not being used;
- Medium-range mobile transceivers, such as those used in police cars, fire trucks, ambulances, and taxis. These usually have the antenna mounted on the outside of the vehicle; and
- 3) Long-range transmitters and transceivers, such as commercial broadcast transmitters (radio and TV broadcast antenna towers) and amateur (HAM) radios.

NOTE: Other types of hand-held devices, such as cordless phones, laptop computers, AM/FM radios, TV sets, CD players, cassette players, and small appliances, such as electric shavers and hair dryers, so far as we know, are not likely to cause EMI problems to your powered scooter.

Powered Scooter Electromagnetic Interference (EMI)

Because EM energy rapidly becomes more intense as one moves closer to the transmitting antenna (source), the EM fields from hand-held radio wave sources (transceivers) are of special concern. It is possible to unintentionally bring high levels of EM energy very close to the powered scooter's control system while using these devices. This can affect powered scooter movement and braking. Therefore, the warnings listed are recommended to prevent possible interference with the control system of the powered scooter.


Electromagnetic interference (EMI) from sources such as radio and TV stations, amateur radio (HAM) transmitters, two-way radios, and cellular phones can affect powered scooters. Following the warnings listed should reduce the chance of unintended brake release or powered scooter movement which could result in serious injury.

- Do not operate hand-held transceivers (transmitters receivers), such as citizens band (CB radios, or turn ON personal communication devices, such as cellular phones, while the powered scooter is turned ON;
- Be aware of nearby transmitters, such as radio or TV stations, and try to avoid coming close to them;
- If unintended movement or brake release occurs, turn the powered scooter OFF as soon as it is safe;
- 4) Be aware that adding accessories or components, or modifying the powered scooter, may make it more susceptible to EMI (Note: There is no easy way to evaluate their effect on the overall immunity of the powered scooter); and
- 5) Report all incidents of unintended movement or brake release to the powered scooter manufacturer, and note whether there is a source of EMI nearby.

Important Information

- 20 volts per meter (V/m) is a generally achievable and useful immunity level against EMI (as of May 1994) (the higher the level, the greater the protection);
- 2) The immunity level of this product is unknown.

Safety Inspection Checklist

Maintenance

NOTE: Every six (6) months take the scooter to a qualified dealer for a thorough inspection and servicing. Regular cleaning will reveal loose or worn parts and enhance the smooth operation of the scooter. To operate properly and safely, the scooter must be cared for just like any other vehicle. Routine maintenance will extend the life and efficiency of the scooter.

Initial adjustments should be made to suit your personal body structure and preference. Thereafter follow these maintenance procedures:

MAINTENANCE

WARNING

After ANY adjustments, repair or service and BEFORE use, make sure that all attaching hardware is tightened securely - otherwise, injury or damage may occur.

CAUTION

DO NOT over-tighten hardware attaching to the frame. This could cause damage to the frame.




FIGURE 1 - INITIAL MAINTENANCE PROCEDURES

Initial Maintenance Procedures (FIGURE 1)

- 1. Before using the powered scooter, make sure all nuts and bolts are tight. Check any parts for damage or wear and replace. Check all parts for proper adjustment.
- 2. Ensure that batteries are properly maintained and charged as required (PROCEDURE 4 of Owner's Manual, part number 1090132).
- 3. Inspect brake for proper operation (PROCEDURE 3 of Owner's Manual, part number 1090132).

CAUTION

Ensure that the cover is removed from the grease nipple BEFORE operation of the PANTHER MX-4 scooter. Otherwise, damage to the scooter may occur.

4. For the **PANTHER MX-4 ONLY**, remove the cover from the grease nipple located on TOP of the transaxle assembly (FIGURE 1).

Periodic Maintenance Procedures

- 1. The wheels and tires should be checked periodically for cracks and wear, and should be replaced by a qualified technician.
- 2. Regularly check for loose nuts and/or bolts in the front and rear wheels. If loose, have them adjusted by a qualified technician (PROCEDURE 9 of Owner's Manual, part number 1090132).
- 3. Clean dirt, dust and grease from exposed components.

SAFETY INSPECTION/MAINTENANCE/TROUBLESHOOTING **PROCEDURE 2**




FIGURE 2 - LUBRICATION POINTS

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С E **Lubrication Points (FIGURE 2)**

- 1. Every six (6) months the following components should be lubricated. Use a Teflon® lubricant. (FIGURE 2).
 - A. Seat Lever, Connecting Pin, and Release Pin.
 - B. Axle of Scooter.
 - C. Top of Seat Adaptor.

- D. For Models LYNX SX-3P, LYNX SX-3, LYNX LX-3, and LYNX LX-3 wheel Bearings of Front Wheel.
- 2. For all Models EXCEPT the PANTHER MX 4:
 - A. Remove the four (4) bolts securing the gearbox cover to the transaxle and remove the gearbox cover.
 - B. Lubricate the gears inside the transaxle with Black Pearl Grease® OR equivalent.

This Procedure Includes the Following:

Replacing Seat Post

WARNING

After ANY adjustments, repair or service and BEFORE use, make sure that all attaching hardware is tightened securely - otherwise injury or damage may occur.




FIGURE 1 - REPLACING SEAT POST

REPLACING SEAT POST (FIGURE 1)

WARNING

Ensure that seat is locked into the forward position BEFORE and DURING operation of the scooter. Otherwise, injury to the user and/or damage to the scooter may result.

1. Remove the seat. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALLING</u> <u>THE SEAT</u> in PROCEDURE 5 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.

NOTE: The swivel release lever is located just beneath the seat on the right side.

- 2. Pull the swivel release lever up.
- 3. While holding the swivel release lever in the upward position, pull the seat post out of the seat frame.

4. While holding the swivel release lever in the upward position, insert the NEW seat post into the seat frame.

NOTE: The seat post locks at 90° intervals. In order to ensure that the NEW seat post is locked into position, it may be necessary to rotate the seat post until an audible "click" is heard.

- 5. Release the swivel release lever, allowing the NEW seat post to lock into place.
- 6. Reinstall the seat. Referto <u>REMOVING/INSTALLING</u> <u>THE SEAT</u> in PROCEDURE 5 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.

WARNING

After ANY adjustments, repair or service and BEFORE use, make sure that ALL attaching hardware is tightened securely - otherwise, injury or damage may occur.

Turn Power OFF and remove key from ignition. Disconnect battery harness from motor lead.




FIGURE 1 - REPLACING HAND GRIPS

REPLACING HAND GRIPS (FIGURE 1)

- 1. Grasp the hand grip and twist it off of the handle bar.
- 2. Slide the NEW hand grip over the handle bar.
- 3. If necessary, repeat STEPS 1-2 for the other hand grip.




FIGURE 2 - REPLACING LED CANOPY

REPLACING LED CANOPY (FIGURE 2)

NOTE: This procedure applies to all models EXCEPT the Panther MX - 4.

- 1. Grasp one (1) of the pointed locking tabs of the LED canopy under the front cover and squeeze the ends of it together.
- 2. While squeezing the ends, slowly pull the pointed locking tab through the front cover and through the electronics board.

- 3. Repeat this procedure for the other pointed locking tab of the LED canopy.
- 4. Remove the EXISTING LED canopy and the EXISTING rubber gasket.
- 5. Discard the EXISTING LED canopy and the EXISTING rubber gasket.

NOTE: Before installing the NEW LED canopy, be sure the NEW rubber gasket is between the NEW LED canopy and the front cover.

- 6. Align the NEW LED canopy with the mounting holes in the front cover and snap it into place.
- 7. Align the pointed locking tabs of the NEW LED canopy with the mounting holes in the electronics board, and snap the electronics board into place.





FIGURE 3 - REPLACING THROTTLE LEVER

REPLACING THROTTLE LEVER (FIGURE 3)

1. Remove the four (4) self-tapping screws and housings securing the cable cover to the tiller assembly.

NOTE: Save the four (4) self tapping screws and housings for reuse when installing the NEW throttle lever.


- 2. Slowly remove the cable cover from the tiller assembly and allow it to hang by the connecting wires.
- 3. Remove the two (2) socket screws securing the throttle lever to the potentiometer assembly.
- 4. Remove the throttle lever from the potentiometer assembly.

NOTE: To ensure the NEW throttle lever performs correctly, make certain the tab on the back of the NEW throttle lever is positioned between the two (2) ends of the spring on the potentiometer assembly. (DETAIL "A")

- 5. Position the NEW throttle lever on the potentiometer assembly.
- 6. Secure the NEW throttle lever to the potentiometer assembly using the two (2) NEW socket screws. Securely tighten.
- 7. Align the four (4) mounting holes in the cable cover with the four (4) mounting holes in the tiller assembly.
- 8. Secure the cable cover to the tiller assembly using the four (4) EXISTING self-tapping screws and housings. Securely tighten.

REMOVING/INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY

WARNING

Ensure that tiller is properly adjusted before driving the scooter. Refer to <u>TILLER</u> <u>ADJUSTMENT</u> in PROCEDURE 8 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.

After making ANY tiller angle adjustments and BEFORE use, the tiller MUST be securely locked into position with adjustment pin protruding through the adjustment plate.



A fall from the scooter could occur causing bodily injury and/or damage to the scooter. Gently, push/pull against tiller to ensure that the tiller is securely engaged into the adjustment plate.

NOTE: When removing the tiller assembly, perform the following steps:

STEP 1: Determine the scooter model to be serviced.

STEP 2: Carefully review the following chart to determine the necessary sections and the specific order in which these sections need to be performed.

NOTE: The sections outlined below are to remove the tiller assembly. To install the tiller assembly, reverse the order of the outlined sections.


DISASSEMBLING.

- If necessary, remove the floor basket. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALLING THE FLOOR BAS-</u> <u>KET</u> in PROCEDURE 11 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- Remove the batteries. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-STALLING THE BATTERIES WITH CABLES</u> in PROCEDURE 4 of the Owners Manual, part number 1090132.
- If necessary, remove the on board battery charger. Refer to <u>REPLACING ON - BOARD</u> <u>BATTERY CHARGER</u> in PROCEDURE 11 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.

- 4. Separate the front frame assembly from the rear frame assembly. Refer to <u>TRANSPORTING THE</u> <u>SCOOTER</u> in PROCEDURE 10 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 5. Position the front frame assembly on its side.

NOTE: Note the position of the tie wraps before removing.

- 6. Cut the cable ties securing the tiller wiring harness to the underside of the front frame assembly.
- 7. For PANTHER MX 4 cut the cable ties securing the brake cable to the underside of the front frame assembly.
- 8. Remove the tiller wiring harness from the retaining tabs on the underside of the front frame assembly.



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- 9. For PANTHER MX 4, remove the brake cable from the retaining tabs on the underside of the front frame assembly.
- 10. Refer to the chart on page 11 of this manual to determine which section(s) need to be performed next to successfully complete the removal/installation of the tiller assembly.

ASSEMBLING.

- 1. Secure the tiller wiring harness in the retaining tabs on the underside of the front frame assembly.
- 2. For PANTHER MX 4, secure the brake cable in the retaining tabs on the underside of the front frame assembly.

NOTE: Before installing the cable ties, be sure they are in the proper positions.

- 3. Secure the tiller wiring harness to the underside of the front frame assembly using NEW cable ties.
- 4. For PANTHER MX 4, secure the brake cable to the underside of the front frame assembly using NEW cable ties.
- 5. Return the front frame assembly to the upright position.
- 6. Reassemble the front frame assembly and the rear frame assembly. Refer to <u>TRANSPORT-ING THE SCOOTER</u> in PROCEDURE 10 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 7. If necessary, reinstall the on board battery charger. Refer to <u>REPLACING ON - BOARD BATTERY</u> <u>CHARGER</u> in PROCEDURE 11 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- Reinstall the batteries. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-STALLING THE BATTERIES WITH CABLES</u> in PROCEDURE 4 of the Owners Manual, part number 1090132.
- Reinstall the floor basket. Refer to <u>REMOVING/</u> <u>INSTALLING THE FLOOR BASKET</u> in PRO-CEDURE 11 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.





FIGURE 5 - DISCONNECTING/ CONNECTING HAND BRAKE ASSEMBLY

Section B - Disconnecting/Connecting Hand Brake Cable Assembly (FIGURE 5)

NOTE: This procedure applies to the PANTHER MX - 4 ONLY.

DISCONNECTING.

NOTE: Note the distance that the adjusting nut is threaded on the hand brake cable assembly before removing for proper reinstallation.

- 1. Remove the adjusting nut from the hand brake cable assembly.
- 2. Slide the hand brake cable assembly out of the brake arm joint, the spring and the tab on the rear frame assembly.
- 3. Remove the spring.
- 4. Remove the brake arm joint from the disc brake assembly.

NOTE: Save the hand brake cable assembly and all components for reassembly.

5. Refer to the chart on page 11 of this manual to determine which section(s) need to be performed next to successfully complete the removal/installation of the tiller assembly.

CONNECTING.

- 1. Position the brake arm joint in the mounting hole in the disc brake assembly.
- 2. Position the spring between the tab on the rear frame and the brake arm joint.
- 3. Slide the hand brake cable assembly through the tab on the rear frame, the spring and the brake arm joint.
- 4. Thread the adjusting nut onto the hand brake cable assembly until there is approximately 1/2 inch of thread showing.
- 5. Refer to the chart on page 11 of this manual to determine which section(s) need to be performed next to successfully complete the removal/installation of the tiller assembly.

Section C - Disconnecting/Connecting Head light Assembly (FIGURE 6)

DISCONNECTING.

- 1. For LYNX LX 3 ONLY slowly pull the head light assembly away from the base handle bar joint.
- 2. Pull back the plastic guards on the **RED** and **BLACK** cables connecting the tiller wiring harness to the head light assembly.
- 3. Disconnect the **RED** and **BLACK** cable metal connectors of the head light assembly from the **RED** and **BLACK** cable metal connectors of the tiller wiring harness.
- 4. Separate the head light assembly from the tiller wiring harness.
- 5. Refer to the chart on page 11 of this manual to determine which section(s) need to be performed next to successfully complete the removal/installation of the tiller assembly.



CONNECTING (FIGURE 6).

- 1. Connect the **RED** cable metal connector of the head light assembly to the RED cable metal connector of the tiller wiring harness.
- 2. Connect the **BLACK** cable metal connector of the head light assembly to the **BLACK** cable metal connector of the tiller wiring harness.
- 3. Reposition the plastic guards on the RED and BLACK cables connecting the tiller wiring harness to the head light assembly.
- 4. For LYNX LX 3 ONLY, slowly thread the wires of the head light assembly through the hole in the shroud, until most of the wires of the head light assembly are on the underside of the front frame assembly.




FIGURE 7 - DISCONNECTING/CONNECTING TILLER ASSEMBLY AND HANDLE BAR JOINT

Section D - Disconnecting/Connecting **Tiller Assembly And Handle Bar Joint** (FIGURE 7)

DISCONNECTING.

- 1. Return the front frame assembly to the upright position.
- 2. Remove the bolt, small washer, two (2) large washers and self-locking nut securing the base handle bar joint to the tiller assembly.
- 3. Slowly pull the tiller assembly away from the front frame assembly until there is no slack left in the tiller wiring harness (DETAIL "A").
- 4. Refer to the chart on page 11 of this manual to determine which section(s) need to be performed next to successfully complete the removal/installation of the tiller assembly.

CONNECTING.

NOTE: To simplify this procedure, lay the tiller assembly on the shroud and then align the necessary components.

1. Align the mounting hole in the tiller assembly with the holes in the two (2) large washers and with the mounting holes in the base handle bar joint.


CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the bolt securing tiller assembly to the base handle bar joint. The tiller will bind and not work properly.

Secure the tiller assembly to the base handle bar 2. joint using the provided bolt, small washer, and self-locking nut, making sure the bolt passes through the two (2) large washers. Torgue the locking nut between 3 - 6 in./lbs.

- 3. Push any remaining slack in the tiller wiring harness through the hole in the shroud, until the wiring harness is on the underside of the front frame assembly (DETAIL "A").
- 4. Flip the front frame assembly onto its side.
- 5. Refer to the chart on page 11 of this manual to determine which section(s) need to be performed next to successfully complete the removal/installation of the tiller assembly.

TILLER




FIGURE 7 - DISCONNECTING/ CONNECTING BASE HANDLE BAR JOINT FROM/TO FRONT FRAME ASSEMBLY

Section E - Disconnecting/Connecting Base Handle Bar Joint From/To Front Frame Assembly (FIGURE 7)

DISCONNECTING.

- Remove the two (2) bolts and self-locking nuts securing the base handle bar joint (and for the LYNX LX - 3 ONLY, the head light assembly) to the front frame assembly.
- 2. Refer to the chart on page 11 of this manual to determine which section(s) need to be performed next to successfully complete the removal/installation of the tiller assembly.

CONNECTING.

- 1. Align the two (2) mounting holes in the base handle bar joint with the two (2) mounting holes in the front frame assembly.
- For the LYNX LX 3, align the two (2) mounting holes in the head light assembly with the two (2) mounting holes in the front frame assembly and the two (2) mounting holes in the base handle bar joint.
- 3. Secure the base handle bar joint (and for the LYNX LX 3, the head light assembly) to the front frame assembly using the two (2) bolts and self-locking nuts. Securely tighten.
- 4. Refer to the chart on page 11 of this manual to determine which section(s) need to be performed next to successfully complete the removal/installation of the tiller assembly.

Section F - Removing/Installing Tiller From/To Front Frame Assembly (FIGURE 8)

REMOVING.

- 1. Slowly pull the tiller wiring harness through the hole in the shroud assembly, until the tiller assembly is free from the front frame assembly (DETAIL "A").
- 2. Pull the base handle bar joint from the front frame assembly (DETAIL "B").
- 3. Remove the boot. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALL-</u> <u>ING BOOT</u> in this procedure of this manual.
- 4. Refer to the chart on page 11 of this manual to determine which section(s) need to be performed next to successfully complete the removal/installation of the tiller assembly.

INSTALLING.


- 1. Reinstall the boot. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALL-</u> <u>ING BOOT</u> in this procedure of this manual.
- 2. Position the base handle bar joint in the front frame assembly, making sure the mounting holes in the base handle bar joint line up with the mounting holes in the front frame assembly (DETAIL "A").
- 3. Slowly thread the tiller wiring hamess through the hole in the shroud, until most of the tiller wiring harness is on the underside of the front frame assembly.
- 4. Refer to the chart on page 11 of this manual to determine which section(s) need to be performed next to successfully complete the removal/installation of the tiller assembly.

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FROM/TO FRONT FRAME ASSEMBLY




FIGURE 9 - REMOVING/INSTALLING BOOT

REMOVING/INSTALLING BOOT (FIGURE 9)

Removing

- 1. Remove the tiller assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-ING/INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in this procedure of this manual.
- 2. Remove the **EXISTING** boot by sliding it over the front fork with bearing assembly.

Installing

- 1. Install the **NEW** boot by sliding it over the front fork with bearing assembly.
- 2. Install the tiller assembly. Refer to <u>REMOVING/</u> <u>INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in this procedure of this manual.

REPLACING TIRE AND TUBE

WARNING

This procedure MUST be performed by an authorized Invacare dealer or qualified technician.

REMOVING/INSTALLING FRONT SHROUD ASSEMBLY (FIGURE 1)

Removing

- 1. Pull up on the rug to remove it from the front shroud assembly.
- 2. Remove the tiller assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in PRO-CEDURE 4 of this manual.
- 3. Remove the boot. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALL-</u> <u>ING BOOT</u> in PROCEDURE 4 of this manual.
- 4. Remove the two (2) mounting screws, spring washers and flat washers securing the front shroud assembly to the front frame assembly.

NOTE: Four (4) mounting screws, spring washers and flat washers are required on the PANTHER LX - 4.

- 5. Perform one (1) of the following:
 - A. LYNX SX-3, LYNX SX-3P and LYNX LX-3:
 - 1. Proceed to STEP 6.

B. PANTHER LX - 4:

1. Remove the front head light assembly. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALLING</u> <u>FRONT HEAD LIGHT ASSEMBLY</u> in PROCEDURE 10 of this manual.

C. PANTHER MX - 4:

- 1. Remove the front head light assembly. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALLING</u> <u>FRONT HEAD LIGHT ASSEMBLY</u> in PROCEDURE 11 of this manual.
- 6. Remove the front shroud assembly from the front frame assembly.
- 7. Note the position of the U-type plate nuts before removing for proper reinstallation.
- 8. Remove the U-type plate nuts from the front frame assembly.

NOTE: The LYNX SX - 3, LYNX SX - 3P and LYNX LX - 3 have four (4) U-type plate nuts, the PANTHER LX - 4 and PANTHER MX - 4 have two (2) U-type plate nuts.

Installing

- 1. Place U-type plate nuts in position noted from STEP 7 of REMOVING.
- 2. Perform one (1) of the following:

A. LYNX SX-3, LYNX SX-3P and LYNX LX-3:

1. Position the four (4) U-type plate nuts on the front frame, making certain the mounting holes in the U-type plate nuts align with the mounting holes in the front frame assembly.

B. PANTHER MX - 4 and PANTHER LX - 4:


- 1. Position the two (2) U-type plate nuts on the front frame, making certain the mounting holes in the U-type plate nuts align with the mounting holes in the front frame assembly.
- 3. Place the front shroud assembly over the front frame, making certain the mounting holes in the front shroud assembly align with the mounting holes in the U-type plate nuts and/or the mount-ing holes in the front frame assembly.
- 4. Secure the front shroud assembly to the front frame using the two (2) mounting screws, spring washers and flat washers. Securely Tighten.

NOTE: Four (4) mounting screws, spring washers and flat washers are required on the PANTHER LX - 4.

- 5. Perform one (1) of the following:
 - A. LYNX SX 3, LYNX SX 3P, LYNX LX 3 and PANTHER LX - 4 :
 - 1. Proceed to STEP 5.
 - B. PANTHER LX 4:
 - 1. Reinstall the front head light assembly. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALLING THE</u> <u>FRONT HEAD LIGHT ASSEMBLY</u> in PROCEDURE 10 of this manual.
- C. PANTHER MX 4:
 - 1. Reinstall the front head light assembly. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALLING THE</u> <u>FRONT HEAD LIGHT ASSEMBLY</u> in PROCEDURE 11 of this manual.
- 6. Reinstall the boot. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALL-</u> <u>ING BOOT</u> in PROCEDURE 4 of this manual.
- 7. Reinstall the tiller assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in PRO-CEDURE 4 of this manual.
- 8. Position the rug on the shroud assembly.






FIGURE 2 - REMOVING/INSTALLING FORK WITH BEARING ASSEMBLY

REMOVING/INSTALLING FORK WITH BEARING ASSEMBLY (FIGURE 2)

NOTE: This procedure applies to the LYNX SX - 3, LYNX SX - 3P and the LYNX LX - 3 ONLY.

Removing

- 1. Remove the tiller assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in PRO-CEDURE 4 of this manual.
- 2. Remove the front shroud assembly. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALLING FRONT SHROUD</u> <u>ASSEMBLY</u> in PROCEDURE 5 of this manual.
- 3. Remove the front wheel. Refer to <u>REMOVING/</u> <u>INSTALLING THE FRONT WHEELS</u> in PRO-CEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 4. Remove the bearing gap nut from the front fork.
- 5. Remove the **TOP** bearing bushing from the **TOP** bearing housing.
- 6. Remove the **TOP** bearing from the **TOP** bearing housing.
- 7. Slide the front fork, **BOTTOM** bearing and **BOT-TOM** bearing bushing away from the front frame assembly.
- 8. Remove the **TOP** and **BOTTOM** bearing housings from the front frame assembly.

Installing

1. Secure the **TOP** and **BOTTOM** bearing housing onto the front frame assembly.

NOTE: Before installing the front fork, be sure it is facing the proper direction.

- 2. Slide the front fork with the **BOTTOM** bearing and the **BOTTOM** bearing bushing through the mounting hole in the front frame assembly.
- 3. Slide the **TOP** bearing over the top of the front fork and into the **TOP** bearing housing.

CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the TOP bearing bushing. Otherwise, damage to the front fork assembly may occur. 4. Secure the **TOP** bearing bushing by threading it into the **TOP** bearing housing. Torque the **TOP** bearing bushing between 26 - 39 in./lbs.

CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the bearing gap nut. Otherwise, damage to the front fork assembly may occur.

5. Secure the bearing gap nut by threading it into the front fork. Torque the bearing gap nut between 217 - 243 in./lbs.

NOTE: When reinstalling the front wheel, replace the **EXISTING** hardware with the **NEW** hardware supplied.

- 6. Reinstall the front wheel. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-</u> <u>STALLING THE FRONT WHEELS</u> in PROCEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 7. Reinstall the shroud assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING FRONT SHROUD ASSEM-</u> <u>BLY</u> in PROCEDURE 5 of this manual.
- 8. Reinstall the tiller assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in PRO-CEDURE 4 of this manual.

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PROCEDURE 5

REMOVING/INSTALLING FRONT AXLE ASSEMBLY

NOTE: This procedure applies to the PANTHER LX - 4 and the PANTHER MX - 4 ONLY.




FIGURE 3 - REMOVING/INSTALLING FRONT AXLE ASSEMBLY - PANTHER LX - 4

Panther LX - 4 (FIGURE 3)

REMOVING.

- 1. Remove the tiller assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in PRO-CEDURE 4 of this manual.
- 2. Remove the shroud assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING SHROUD ASSEMBLY</u> in PROCEDURE 5 of this manual.
- 3. Remove the front wheels. Refer to <u>REMOVING/</u> <u>INSTALLING THE FRONT WHEELS</u> in PRO-CEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 4. Position the front frame assembly onto its side.
- 5. Remove the self-locking nut and spacer securing the front axle assembly to the right front wheel axle assembly.

NOTE: Save the self-locking nut, spacer and washer for reuse when installing the **NEW** front axle assembly.

- 6. Slide the right front wheel axle assembly and the washer away from the front axle assembly.
- 7. Repeat STEPS 4 5 for the left side of the front axle assembly.
- 8. Remove the self-locking nut and three (3) washers securing the front axle assembly to the front frame assembly.
- 9. Slide the front axle assembly and washer away from the front frame assembly.

INSTALLING.

NOTE: Position the two (2) washers between the front frame assembly and the front axle assembly.

1. Position the two (2) washers and front axle assembly onto the front frame assembly.

CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the self-locking nut securing the front axle assembly to the front frame assembly. Otherwise, damage to the front axle assembly may occur.

- 2. Secure the front axle assembly to the front frame using the washer and self-locking nut. Torque the locking nut between 108 135 in./lbs.
- 3. Position the **EXISTING** washer and the right front wheel axle assembly on the front axle assembly.

CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the self-locking nut securing the front axle assembly to the right front wheel axle assembly. Otherwise, damage to the front axle assembly may occur.

- 4. Secure the right front wheel axle assembly to the front axle assembly using the **EXISTING** spacer and self-locking nut. Torque the self-locking nut between 17 30 in./lbs.
- 5. Repeat STEPS 3 4 for the left side of the front axle assembly.
- 6. Return the front frame assembly to the upright position
- 7. Reinstall the front wheels. Refer to <u>REMOVING/</u> <u>INSTALLING THE FRONT WHEELS</u> in PRO-CEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 8. Reinstall the front shroud assembly. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALLING FRONT SHROUD</u> <u>ASSEMBLY</u> in PROCEDURE 5 of this manual.
- 9. Reinstall the tiller assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in PRO-CEDURE 4 of this manual.




FIGURE 4 - REMOVING/INSTALLING FRONT AXLE ASSEMBLY - PANTHER MX - 4

Panther MX - 4 (FIGURE 4)

REMOVING.

- 1. Remove the tiller assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in PRO-CEDURE 4 of this manual.
- 2. Remove the front shroud assembly. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALLING FRONT SHROUD</u> <u>ASSEMBLY</u> in PROCEDURE 5 of this manual.
- 3. Remove the front wheels. Refer to <u>REMOVING/</u> <u>INSTALLING THE FRONT WHEELS</u> in PRO-CEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 4. Position the front frame assembly onto its side.
- 5. Remove the front shock absorbers. Refer to <u>RE-MOVING/INSTALLING FRONT SHOCK AB-SORBERS</u> in PROCEDURE 11 of this manual.

NOTE: Save the self-locking nut, washer and spacer for reuse when installing the **NEW** front axle assembly.

- 6. Remove the self-locking nut and washer securing the right front axle to the tie rod assembly.
- 7. Slide the tie rod assembly and the spacer away from the right front axle.
- 8. Remove the bolt, spring washer and washer securing the right front axle to the front frame assembly.
- 9. Remove the right front axle assembly.
- 10. Repeat STEPS 5 9 to remove the left front axle.

INSTALLING.

1. Align the mounting hole in the right front axle with the mounting hole in the front frame assembly.

CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the bolt securing the right front axle to the front frame assembly. Otherwise, damage to the right front axle may occur.

 Secure the right front axle to the front frame assembly using the washer, spring washer and bolt. Torque the bolt between 191 - 226 in./lbs.

NOTE: Position the spacer between the top of the right front axle and the tie rod assembly.

3. Slide the **EXISTING** spacer and the tie rod assembly onto the mounting pin of the right front axle.

CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the self-locking nut securing the tie rod assembly to the right front axle. Otherwise, damage to the tie rod assembly may occur.

- 4. Secure the tie rod assembly onto the right front axle using the **EXISTING** washer and self-locking nut. Torque the self-locking nut between 17 30 in./lbs.
- 5. Repeat STEPS 1 4 to install the left front axle.
- Reinstall the front shock absorbers. Refer to <u>RE-MOVING/INSTALLING FRONT SHOCK AB-SORBERS</u> in PROCEDURE 11 of this manual.
- 7. Return the front frame assembly to the upright position
- 8. Reinstall the front wheels. Refer to <u>REMOVING/</u> <u>INSTALLING THE FRONT WHEELS</u> in PRO-CEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 9. Reinstall the shroud assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-ING/INSTALLING SHROUD ASSEMBLY</u> in PROCEDURE 5 of this manual.
- 10. Reinstall the tiller assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in PRO-CEDURE 4 of this manual.

- 1. Remove the tiller assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in PRO-CEDURE 4 of this manual.
- 2. Remove the shroud assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING SHROUD ASSEMBLY</u> in PROCEDURE 5 of this manual.
- 3. Remove the front wheels. Refer to <u>REMOVING/</u> <u>INSTALLING THE FRONT WHEELS</u> in PRO-CEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 4. Position the front frame assembly onto its side.
- 5. Remove the front axle assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-ING/INSTALLING FRONT AXLE ASSEMBLY,</u> <u>PANTHER LX - 4</u> in this procedure of this manual.
- 6. Remove the two (2) hex cap screws and self-locking nuts securing the steering shaft to the U - plate on the tie rod assembly.
- 7. Remove the U plate and the tie rod assembly from the steering shaft.
- 8. Remove the bearing gap nut from the steering shaft.
- 9. Remove the **TOP** bearing bushing from the **TOP** bearing housing.
- 10. Remove the **TOP** bearing from the **TOP** bearing housing.
- 11. Remove the steering shaft, **BOTTOM** bearing and the **BOTTOM** bearing bushing from the **BOTTOM** bearing housing.
- 12. Remove the **TOP** and **BOTTOM** bearing housings from the front frame assembly.
- 13. Secure the **NEW TOP** and **BOTTOM** bearing housing onto the front frame assembly.
- 14. Slide the **NEW BOTTOM** bearing and the **NEW BOTTOM** bearing bushing onto the steering shaft.

NOTE: Before installing the **NEW** steering shaft, be sure it is in the proper direction (FIGURE 5).

- 15. Slide the **NEW** steering shaft with the **NEW BOTTOM** bearing and the **NEW BOTTOM** bearing bushing into the front frame assembly.
- Slide the NEW TOP bearing over the top of the NEW steering shaft and into the NEW TOP bearing housing.

CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the TOP bearing bushing. Otherwise, damage to the tie rod assembly may occur.


 Secure the NEW TOP bearing bushing by threading it into the NEW TOP bearing housing. Torque the NEW TOP bearing bushing between 26 - 39 in./lbs.

CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the bearing gap nut. Otherwise, damage to the tie rod assembly may occur.

- 18. Secure the **NEW** bearing gap nut by threading it into the **NEW** steering shaft. Torque the **NEW** bearing gap nut between 216 243 in./lbs.
- 19. Align the two (2) mounting holes in the **NEW** Uplate on the tie rod assembly with the two (2) mounting holes in the **NEW** steering shaft.
- Secure the NEW U-plate and the tie rod assembly to the NEW steering shaft using the two (2) NEW hex cap screws and self-locking nuts. Torque the NEW self-locking nuts between 112 - 138 in./lbs.
- 21. Reinstall the front axle assembly. Refer to <u>RE-MOVING/INSTALLING FRONT AXLE ASSEM-BLY, PANTHER LX 4</u> in this procedure of this manual.
- 22. Return the front frame assembly to the upright position.
- 23. Reinstall the front wheels. Refer to <u>REMOVING/</u> <u>INSTALLING THE FRONT WHEELS</u> in PRO-CEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 24. Reinstall the front shroud assembly. Refer to <u>RE-MOVING/INSTALLING FRONT SHROUD AS-SEMBLY</u> in PROCEDURE 4 of this manual.
- 25. Reinstall the tiller assembly. Refer to <u>REMOV-</u> <u>ING/INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in PRO-CEDURE 3 of this manual.



DO NOT overtighten the self-locking nuts securing the small tie rod to the right front wheel axle. Otherwise, damage to the tie rod may occur.

- Secure the small tie rod to the right front wheel axle using the spring washer and self-locking nut. Securely tighten. Torque the self-locking nut between 112 - 139 in./lbs.
- 5. Return the front frame assembly to the upright position.
- 6. Reinstall the front wheels. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-</u> <u>STALLING THE FRONT WHEELS</u> in PROCEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.




FIGURE 7 - REMOVING/INSTALLING SMALL TIE RODS - PANTHER LX - 4




FIGURE 8 - REMOVING/INSTALLING SMALL TIE RODS - PANTHER MX - 4

- 4. Secure the large tie rod to the right front wheel axle using the **EXISTING** spring washer and self-locking nut. Torque the self-locking nuts between 112 139 in./lbs.
- 5. Return the front frame assembly to the upright position.




FIGURE 9 - REMOVING/INSTALLING LARGE TIE RODS - PANTHER LX - 4




FIGURE 10 - REMOVING/INSTALLING LARGE TIE RODS - PANTHER MX - 4

Turn Power OFF and remove key from ignition. Disconnect battery harness from motor lead.

REMOVING/INSTALLING TRANSAXLE ASSEMBLY

Lynx SX - 3P, Lynx SX - 3, Lynx LX - 3, Panther LX - 4 (FIGURE 1)

REMOVING.

- 1. Remove the seat. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-</u> <u>STALLING THE SEAT</u> in PROCEDURE 5 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 2. Remove the rear shroud. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-</u> <u>STALLING THE REAR SHROUD</u> in PROCEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 3. Remove the batteries. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-</u> <u>STALLING THE BATTERIES WITH CABLES</u> in PROCEDURE 4 of the Owners Manual, part number 1090132.
- 4. Remove the rear wheels. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-</u> <u>STALLING THE REAR WHEELS</u> in PROCEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.

NOTE: For proper reinstallation, note the position of the cable ties securing the transaxle assembly wires before cutting.

- 5. Cut the cable ties securing the transaxle assembly wires to the rear frame assembly.

- 11. Slide the transaxle assembly out of the rear frame assembly.

INSTALLING.

NOTE: Before installing the brackets, be sure they are in the proper mounting positions.

2. Align the mounting holes in the bracket closet to the transaxle with the mounting holes in the rear frame assembly and the mounting holes in the rubber spacer.

CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the two (2) bolts securing the bracket and rubber spacer to the rear frame assembly. Otherwise, damage to the bracket and rubber spacer may occur.

- 3. Install the two (2) bolts, washers, spring washers and self-locking nuts. Torque the two (2) self lock-ing nuts between 130 156 in./lbs.
- 4. Align the mounting holes in the notched bracket closet to the motor with the mounting holes in the rear frame assembly and the mounting holes in the rubber spacer.

CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the two (2) bolts securing the bracket and rubber spacer to the rear frame assembly. Otherwise, damage to the bracket and rubber spacer may occur.








FIGURE 3 - REPLACING MOTOR/BRAKE ASSEMBLY




FIGURE 3 - REMOVING/INSTALLING CONTROLLER HARNESSES - LYNX SX - 3P AND LYNX SX 3








FIGURE 6 - REPLACING CIRCUIT BREAKER




FIGURE 1 - REPLACING TILLER CHARGER PORT COVER




FIGURE 1 - REMOVING/INSTALLING HEAD LIGHT ASSEMBLY

REMOVING/INSTALLING HEAD LIGHT ASSEMBLY (FIGURE 1)

Removing

NOTE: Partial disassembly of the tiller assembly is required to remove the head light assembly.

- 1. Perform SECTIONS "A" and "D" in <u>REMOVING/</u> <u>INSTALLING TILLER ASSEMBLY</u> in PROCE-DURE 3 of this manual.
- 2. Pull back the plastic guards on the **RED** and **BLACK** cables connecting the tiller wiring harness to the head light assembly.
- 3. Disconnect the **RED** and **BLACK** cable metal connectors of the head light assembly from the **RED** and **BLACK** cable metal connectors of the tiller wiring harness.
- 4. Separate the head light assembly from the tiller wiring harness.

Installing

- 1. Connect the **RED** cable metal connector of the head light assembly to the **RED** cable metal connector of the tiller wiring harness.
- 2. Connect the **BLACK** cable metal connector of the head light assembly to the **BLACK** cable metal connector of the tiller wiring harness.
- 3. Reposition the plastic guards on the **RED** and **BLACK** cables connecting the tiller wiring harness to the head light assembly.
- 4. Perform SECTIONS "D" and "A" in <u>PROCE-</u> <u>DURE 3 - REMOVING/INSTALLING TILLER</u> <u>ASSEMBLY</u> in the TILLER section of this manual.


Removing

- 1. Flip the scooter onto its side.
- Pull back the plastic guards on the RED and BLACK cables connecting the tiller wiring harness to the head light assembly (DETAIL "A").
- Disconnect the RED and BLACK cable metal connectors of the head light assembly from the RED and BLACK cable metal connectors of the tiller wiring harness (DETAIL "A").
- 4. Remove the bolt, self-locking nut, spring washer, and washer securing the head light assembly to the front frame assembly.
- 5. Separate the head light assembly from the front frame assembly.

Installing

- 1. Align the bolt in the head light assembly with the mounting holes in the front frame assembly.
- 2. Secure the head light assembly to the front frame assembly using the washer, spring washer and self-locking nut. Securely tighten.
- Connect the RED cable metal connector of the head light assembly to the RED cable metal connector of the tiller wiring harness (DETAIL "A").
- Connect the BLACK cable metal connector of the head light assembly to the BLACK cable metal connector of the tiller wiring harness (DETAIL "A").

- Reposition the plastic guards over the metal connectors on the RED and BLACK cables connecting the tiller wiring harness to the head light assembly (DETAIL "A").
- 6. Return the front frame assembly to the upright position.






REPLACING TILLER CHARGER PORT COVER (FIGURE 2)

NOTE: Save the two (2) mounting screws and selflocking nuts for reuse when installing the **NEW** tiller charger port cover.

- 1. Remove the two (2) mounting screws and selflocking nuts securing the tiller charger port cover to the tiller assembly.
- 2. Remove the tiller charger port from the tiller assembly.
- 3. Align the mounting holes in the **NEW** tiller charger port cover with the mounting holes in the tiller assembly.

Removing The Front Bumper Assembly

CUSHION (DETAIL "A").

- 1. Position the scooter on its side.
- 2. Remove the two (2) mounting screws, spring washers and washers securing the cushion to the front frame assembly.
- 3. Remove the cushion from the front frame assembly
- 4. Align the two (2) mounting holes in the **NEW** cushion with the mounting holes in the front frame assembly.

5. Secure the **NEW** cushion to the front frame assembly using the two (2) **NEW** mounting screws, spring washers and washers. Securely tighten.

PROCEDURE 10

6. Return the scooter to the upright position.

FRONT BUMPER (DETAIL "B").

- 1. Grasp the front bumper firmly and pull it away from the front shroud assembly.
- 2. Position the mounting tape on the bottom of the front shroud assembly.
- 3. Position the **NEW** bumper on the mounting tape on the front shroud assembly.




FIGURE 3 - REPLACING CUSHION/FRONT BUMPER ASSEMBLY




FIGURE 1 - REMOVING/INSTALLING HEAD LIGHT ASSEMBLY

REMOVING/INSTALLING HEAD LIGHT ASSEMBLY (FIGURE 1)

Removing

- 1. Separate the front frame assembly from the rear frame assembly. Refer to <u>TRANSPORTING THE</u> <u>SCOOTER</u> in PROCEDURE 10 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 2. Flip the front frame assembly onto its side.
- 3. Pull back the plastic guards on the **RED** and **BLACK** cables connecting the tiller wiring harness to the head light assembly.
- 4. Disconnect the **RED** and **BLACK** cable metal connectors of the head light assembly from the **RED** and **BLACK** cable metal connectors of the tiller wiring harness.
- 5. Remove the two (2) screws, spring washers and washers securing the front bumper and rubber spacer onto the front shroud assembly.
- 6. Remove the front bumper and rubber spacer from the front shroud assembly.
- 7. Remove the screw, spring washer and washer from the plate securing the top of the head light assembly to the front shroud assembly.

NOTE: Before removing the mounting hardware from the long screw, be sure to take note of the proper position for each components.

- 8. Remove the two (2) self-locking nuts, three (3) washers, spring washer, spring and the long screw securing the bottom of the head light assembly to the bracket on the front frame assembly.
- 9. Remove the head light assembly from the front shroud assembly.

Installing

- 1. Position the head light assembly through the front shroud assembly so the mounting holes on the top and bottom of the head light assembly align with the mounting holes on the top and bottom of the front shroud assembly.
- 2. Position the long screw through the bottom hole in the front shroud assembly, making sure there is a washer on either side of the front shroud assembly.
- 3. Position one (1) nut on the long screw, so that it is flush against the washer on the inside of the front shroud assembly.
- 4. Position the long screw through the bottom hole on the head light assembly.
- 5. Position the spring and one (1) washer on the long screw so that the spring is between the head light assembly and the bracket on the front frame assembly.
- 6. Position the long screw so that it passes through the bracket on the front frame assembly.
- 7. Secure the long screw to the bracket assembly using one (1) spring washer and self-locking nut. Securely tighten.
- 8. Position the plate on the **TOP** of the head light assembly making sure the mounting holes in the plate lines up with the **TOP** mounting hole in the front shroud assembly.
- 9. Secure the plate to the front shroud assembly using one (1) screw, spring washer and washer. Securely tighten.
- 10. Connect the **RED** cable metal connector of the head light assembly in the **RED** cable metal connector of the tiller wiring harness.
- 11. Connect the **BLACK** cable metal connector of the head light assembly in the **BLACK** cable metal connector of the tiller wiring harness.
- 12. Reposition the plastic guards on the **RED** and **BLACK** cables connecting the tiller wiring harness to the head light assembly.

- 13. Position the rubber spacer and the front bumper so that the mounting holes in the rubber spacer and the front bumper align with the mounting holes in the front shroud assembly.
- 14. Secure the rubber spacer and the front bumper to the front shroud assembly using the two (2) screws, spring washers and washers. Securely tighten.
- 15. Return the front frame assembly to the upright position.
- Reassemble the front frame assembly and the rear frame assembly. Refer to <u>TRANSPORT-</u> <u>ING THE SCOOTER</u> in PROCEDURE 10 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.




FIGURE 2 - REPLACING TAIL LIGHT ASSEMBLY

REPLACING TAIL LIGHT ASSEMBLY (FIGURE 2)

- Remove the rear shroud. Refer to <u>REMOVING/</u> <u>INSTALLING THE REAR SHROUD in PROCE-</u> <u>DURE 9</u> of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 2. Disconnect the tail light assembly from the tail light cable by performing STEPS 2-3 in <u>REPLACING</u> <u>TAIL LIGHT CABLE</u> in this procedure of this manual.
- 3. From outside of the rear shroud, grasp the locking tabs on the back of the tail light assembly, and squeeze them together.
- 4. From outside of the rear shroud, slowly pull the tail light assembly and the rubber spacer through steel plate and the holes in the rear shroud.
- 5. Remove the steel plate from the inside of the rear shroud.
- 6. Align the **NEW** tail light assembly with the hole in the rear shroud.

NOTE: To ensure the tail light assembly is installed securely, be sure to position the rubber spacer between the **OUTSIDE** of the rear shroud and the tail light assembly.

- 7. Push the locking tabs of the **NEW** tail light assembly through the rubber spacer and through the hole in the rear shroud until the they "snap" into place.
- 8. Thread the cables of the **NEW** tail light assembly through the **NEW** steel plate, and position the **NEW** steel plate over the locking tabs on the **NEW** tail light assembly
- Connect the tail light assembly to the tail light cable by performing STEPS 6-8 in <u>REPLACING</u> <u>TAIL LIGHT CABLE</u> in this procedure of this manual.
- 10. Reinstall the rear shroud. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-</u> <u>STALLING THE REAR SHROUD in PROCEDURE</u> <u>9</u> of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.

REPLACING TAIL LIGHT CABLES (FIGURE 3)




FIGURE 4 - REPLACING DISC BRAKE ASSEMBLY

REPLACING DISC BRAKE ASSEMBLY (FIGURE 4)

Removing The Disc Brake Assembly

- 1. Remove the seat. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-</u> <u>STALLING THE SEAT</u> in PROCEDURE 5 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 2. Remove the rear shroud. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-</u> <u>STALLING THE REAR SHROUD</u> in PROCEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 3. Remove the rear wheels. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-</u> <u>STALLING THE REAR WHEELS</u> in PROCEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 4. Disconnect the hand brake cable assembly. Refer to <u>REMOVING/INSTALLING TILLER AS-</u> <u>SEMBLY, SECTION "B" - DISCONNECTING/</u> <u>CONNECTING HAND BRAKE CABLE ASSEM-</u> <u>BLY</u> in PROCEDURE 4 of this manual.
- 5. Remove the four (4) hex cap screws and spring washers securing the disc brake assembly to the transaxle assembly.
- 6. Remove the disc brake assembly.
- 7. Align the **NEW** disc brake assembly with the mounting holes in the transaxle assembly.

CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the four (4) hex cap screws securing the disc brake assembly to the transaxle assembly. Otherwise, damage to the disc brake assembly may occur. 8. Secure the **NEW** disc brake assembly to the transaxle assembly using the four (4) **NEW** hex - cap screws and spring washers. Torque the hex cap screws between 43 - 61 in./lbs.

PROCEDURE 11




FIGURE 5 - REPLACING DISC BRAKE ASSEMBLY

REPLACING HAND BRAKE ASSEMBLY (FIGURE 6)

- 1. Remove the bolt securing hand brake assembly to the handle bar. Refer to DETAIL "A".
- Unscrew the adjusting nut from the cable lock and hand brake assembly. Refer to DETAIL "B".
- 3. Align the slit in the cable lock with the brake cable, and remove the cable lock. Refer to DETAIL "C".
- 4. Align the slit in the adjusting nut with the brake cable, and remove the adjusting nut. Refer to DETAIL "C".


NOTE: Note the position of the the hand brake assembly before removing for proper reinstallation.

- 5. Slide the hand brake assembly toward the tiller until there is slack in the brake cable.
- Maneuver the brake cable through the two (2) slits in the hand brake assembly until the brake cable is free from the hand brake assembly (DE-TAIL "D").
- 7. Remove the hand brake assembly from the handle bar.
- 8. Position the **NEW** hand brake assembly onto the handle bar.


NOTE: In order to perform the next step, the **NEW** hand brake assembly should be positioned close enough to the tiller so that there is approximately two (2) inches of slack in the brake cable.

- Maneuver the brake cable through the two slits in the NEW hand brake assembly, making sure the ball at the end of the brake cable is in the proper position in the brake housing. Refer to DETAIL "D".





REMOVING/INSTALLING FRONT SHOCK ABSORBERS (FIGURE 7)

Removing

- 3. Align the mounting hole in the **TOP** of the right front shock absorber with the mounting holes in the front frame.

CAUTION

DO NOT overtighten the bolt securing the right front shock absorber to the front frame assembly. Otherwise, damage to the right front shock absorber may occur.

4. Install one (1) bolt through the **TOP** mounting hole of the right front shock absorber and the **TOP** mounting holes in the front frame assembly. Torque the hex cap screws between 122 - 148 in./lbs. A

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

DO NOT overtighten the bolt securing the right rear shock absorber to the rear frame assembly. Otherwise, damage to the right rear shock absorber may occur.

- Install one (1) bolt through the **TOP** mounting hole in the right rear shock absorber and the TOP mounting holes in the rear frame assembly, making sure the bolt is facing **TOWARD** the controller. Torque the hex cap screws between 122 -148 in./lbs.
- 5. Repeat this procedure for the other rear shock absorber.

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

- 2. Remove the rear shroud. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-</u> <u>STALLING THE REAR SHROUD</u> in PROCEDURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 3. Remove the batteries. Refer to <u>REMOVING IN-</u> <u>STALLING BATTERIES WITH CABLES</u> in PRO-CEDURE 4 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 4. Peform one (1) of the following:

ALL models EXCEPT the PANTHER MX - 4 -

A. Disconnect the YELLOW connector of the tiller wiring harness from the YELLOW connector of the controller wiring harness.

PANTHER MX - 4 -

- A. Disconnect the WHITE connector of the tiller wiring harness from the WHITE connector of the controller wiring harness.
- B. Gently pull open the hinged strain relief on the rear of the WHITE connector of the tiller wiring harness.
- 5. Locate the YELLOW wire coming out of the rear of the YELLOW or WHITE connector (depending on scooter model) of the tiller wiring harness.
- 6. Insert a small, pointed tool into the FRONT of the YELLOW or WHITE connector (depending on scooter model) of the tiller wiring harness, directly under the MALE pin of the YELLOW wire.
- 7. Push up on and hold the plastic tang under the male pin of the YELLOW wire.

- 8. While perfoming STEP 7, pull the YELLOW wire out from the back of the YELLOW or WHITE connector (depending on scooter model) of the tiller wiring harness.
- 9. Repeat STEPS 5-8 for the ORANGE wire coming out of the rear of the YELLOW or WHITE connector (depending on scooter model) of the tiller wiring harness.
- 10. Align the MALE pin of the YELLOW wire with the slot formerly occupied by the MALE pin of the ORANGE wire in the REAR of the YELLOW or WHITE connector (depending on scooter model) of the tiller wiring harness.
- 11. Push the MALE pin of the YELLOW wire forward through the slot until it "clicks" into place.
- 12. Repeat STEPS 10-11 to position the MALE pin of the ORANGE wire into the slot fromerly occupied by the MALE pin of YELLOW wire.

NOTE: WHEN the YELLOW or WHITE connector (depending on scooter model) of the tiller wiring harness and the YELLOW or WHITE connector (depending on scooter model) of the controller wiring harness are reconnected, the mating of the wires coming out of the rear of the connectors should be YELLOW to ORANGE.


- 13. Perform one (1) of the following:
 - ALL models EXCEPT the **PANTHER MX 4** -
 - A. Reconnect the YELLOW connector of the tiller wiring harness to the YELLOW connector of the controller wiring harness.

PANTHER MX - 4 -

- A. Gently close the hinged strain relief on the rear of the WHITE connector of the tiller wiring harness.
- B. Reconnect the WHITE connector of the tiller wiring harness to the WHITE connector of the controller wiring harness.
- 14. Reinstall the batteries. Refer to <u>REMOVING IN-</u> <u>STALLING BATTERIES WITH CABLES</u> in PRO-CEDURE 4 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- Reinstall the rear shroud. Refer to <u>REMOVING/</u> <u>INSTALLING THE REAR SHROUD</u> in PROCE-DURE 9 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.
- 16. Reinstall the seat. Refer to <u>REMOVING/IN-</u> <u>STALLING THE SEAT</u> in PROCEDURE 5 of the Owner's Manual, part number 1090132.

OVER the EXISTING Forward/Reverse sticker on the control panel (DETAIL "A").

17. Position the NEW Forward/Reverse sticker NOTE: The NEW Forward/Reverse sticker is also available as a purchase part.
